WCNS recognized for YN Program!

At the recent NH Coin Expo, the New England Numismatic Association (NENA) presented our club, the Worcester County Numismatic Society, with an award marking our outstanding Young Numismatists (YN) Program over a period of many years – by far the most comprehensive program in New England. The award also recognized the achievement of our current YN Chair, Mark Matys. Congratulations to the club and to Mark for this great recognition.

Coin In the Spotlight 1836 Flying Eagle Dollar


After the 1834 proof sets were delivered using 1804dated dollars and eagles, a decision was made to reintroduce the silver dollar as a circulating issue.

In 1836, Christian Gobrecht engraved a beautiful Liberty Seated obverse based on a drawing by Thomas Sully, and a Flying Eagle reverse based on a drawing by Titian Peale of "Old Pete" – the Philadelphia Mint's late bald eagle.

Initially struck as a pattern, a few were delivered to President Andrew Jackson, who approved the design. In December 1836, 1,000 pieces were coined, the majority being delivered to the Bank of the United States for circulation. Thus, this famous pattern did actually become a commercial issue. Most of the 600-750 survivors show circulation wear, and many were holed for use as jewelry. While not particularly rare, they are prized for their great beauty.

Today we know these coins as Gobrecht Dollars.
