

### Krause Publications to cease publishing the Standard Catalogs

At our November meeting, Fred Liberatore reported that according to the November 2<sup>nd</sup> issue of *Numismatic News*, Krause Publications announced that they will no longer be publishing their *Standard Catalog of World Coins*, the phonebook-sized reference books, each covering a century of world coins with invaluable information (history, composition, precious metal content, mintages, values, etc. Going forward, this will be web-based, via subscription. So you may want to save your past copies of these books.

### Improbable Events Do happen Once in A While By Fred Liberatore

The November 12th Worcester Coin Club meeting had the raffle with the proceeds to be donated. Roughly 30 club members were present and it looked like 30 tickets were in the bin. That gave everyone about 3% odds of winning, assuming 1 ticket per person. I was astonished to hear my ticket number called to win the 1-ounce silver medal. As is club custom, a basket was held above my head for drawing the door prize. I made some remark about not drawing my ticket number, and promptly did so! A club member remarked he had not seen that happen before, ever.

I know enough about statistical probability to estimate the odds of this event happening, assuming 30 members present, and ticket sales the same. It is roughly  $0.03 \ge 0.03$  or .0009. That is 0.09%, which is close enough to one-tenth of 1%, or 1 chance in a thousand. That equates to once in 100 years, assuming 10 meetings a year!

But it could happen again at the next meeting. That's probability for you. It was a day of Happy Collecting!
