# Coin in the Spotlight - 1822 Bust Quarter, 25/50

In the Bust quarter series, the 1822 is a better date. A lower mintage coin, it is difficult to find nice. However, one of the most interesting varieties of entire the series is from 1822. It is the 25/50 variety.

By mistake, one of the reverse dies was made with "50 C" for the denomination, in error. Perhaps the engraver thought he was making a half dollar die? The error was discovered before use and corrected by punching a "25" over the "50" in its place.

The fix was apparently considered unsatisfactory, and the reverse die was quickly pulled from the press and replaced with a new, normal, reverse die. Surely this was when the coiner saw the resulting coins and was horrified at the results. (Seeing one of these coins in person really bears out how obvious the mistake was.) We also know the die was pulled quickly because of the very few survivors that are known today. It is estimated that only about 40 examples exist in all grades, with 8 or so in grades above VF.

The 1822 25/50 C is highly prized by specialists.

Perhaps most surprising is that the defective die was not discarded, but rather was put on the shelf and forgotten. By accident, a coiner pulled this old die off the shelf in 1828 and used it to make quarters once again, with the same result. The error was caught again, but probably not as quickly, as there are about 90 examples of the 1828 25/50 C coins known.
