And finally, here's a Save the Date for Friday June 14th and our club season-ending meeting and hot dog feast.



Coin in the Spotlight: 1877 Indian Cent

The key date of the Indian cent series, this issue does not have the lowest mintage at 852,500 (the 1909-S takes that honor at 309,000). However, since the 1877 occurred in the middle of the series, and fewer people collected coins in earlier years, it is decidedly scarcer than 1909-S, which came at the end of the series and with more collectors around to save them.

All circulation strikes (non-proofs) have a weak N in ONE on the reverse, which is an important aid in authentication, although the proofs (including circulated ones) have a strong N. Therefore care must be exercised when examining an 1877 cent, as many counterfeits and altered coins exist.

One thing most people don't know is that the date 1877 actually has the 7s with two different shapes! The bottom of the second 7 gets "fatter" more quickly than the first 7 as one

looks down the digit. Another marker for a genuine 1877 is that the lower left of the second 7 has a flat spot (versus a constant curve). This peculiarity is extremely difficult to replicate, and won't be on counterfeits or altered dates.
