### Coin in the Spotlight: 1909-S Indian Head Cent

Even though the famous 1877 is the key date of the series and prices as such, the 1909-S actually has the lowest mintage, at 309,000. Because it was the last of its kind, it was saved to some extent, but still costs a pretty penny!

It is easy to compare the 1909-S Indian to the first-of-its-kind and higher mintage 1909-S VDB. About 3,000 survive in all grades, compared to 50,000 for the S-VDB! But this Indian cent sells for much less than the Lincoln.



### 1909-S Indian Head cent, Extremely Fine – note weakness in feather tops, and mintmark style

Because of its value, this date is often found as a fake. Genuine examples always have striking weakness at the tops of the feathers in the headdress. The mintmark is a large open S with the top serif closer to the curve of the S than the bottom serif. Also, many 1909-S coins have a wood-grained appearance that is not found on altered P-mint coins.
