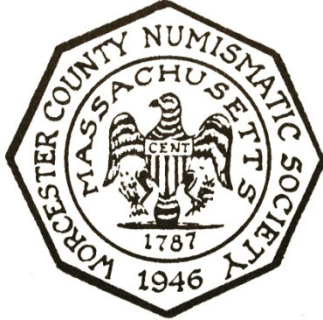

## Coin in the Spotlight 1852 Liberty Seated Dollar

With the lowest business strike mintage of any U.S. silver dollar, the 1852 Liberty Seated dollar is one of the least-publicized rarities in all of U.S. coinage. It boasts an original mintage of just 1,100 coins, even less than that of the fabled 1794 dollar.

Rarity? Most people have never seen one. Fewer than 50 are known, with about half of them in mint state. This compares to almost 150 known of the 1794 issue, at a fraction of the price. This coin, and its sister coin, the 1851, are so rare that they don't even appear in most Seated Dollar coin albums.
